Background and Methodology

Patrick E. Gonzales graduated magna cum laude from the University of Baltimore with a degree in political science.

His career in the field of public opinion research began in the mid-1980s as an analyst with *Mason-Dixon Opinion Research*. During this time, Mr. Gonzales helped develop, craft and implement election surveys and exit polls for television and radio in the Baltimore-Washington D.C. metro area.

Patrick Gonzales has polled and analyzed well over a thousand elections in Maryland and across the country since that time. Furthermore, Mr. Gonzales and his associates have conducted numerous market research projects, crafting message development plans and generating strategy blueprints for businesses and organizations throughout the state.

Over his 35 years conducting public opinion polls, Patrick Gonzales has been widely recognized by his peers for his ability to conduct unbiased surveys, and analyze the results in an impartial, evenhanded manner.

Mr. Gonzales frequently appears on radio and television in the Baltimore-D.C. region as a guest commentator.

This poll was conducted by *Gonzales Research & Media Services* from April 29th through May 4th, 2019. A total of 826 registered voters in Maryland, who indicated that they are likely to vote in next year's general election, were queried by live telephone interviews, utilizing both landline and cell phone numbers. A cross-section of interviews was conducted throughout the state, reflecting general election voting patterns.

The margin of error (MOE), per accepted statistical standards, is a range of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points. If the entire population was surveyed, there is a 95% probability that the true numbers would fall within this range.

An oversample of 203 Republican voters - who indicated that they are likely to vote in the 2020 GOP primary election - was also conducted. The MOE for this group is plus or minus 7 percentage points.

Synopsis

My fellow Marylanders, our long national nightmare is over...oops, sorry, that was another president. However, what Gerald Ford said next, "Our Constitution works. Our great Republic is a government of laws and not of men," is as apt today as it was 45 years ago, when Ford uttered these words.

We asked voters if they thought Special Counsel Robert Mueller's recently completed investigation into Russian collusion was fair and objective, or not. Statewide, 64% say that Mueller's investigation was fair and objective, while 22% say it wasn't.

We next asked, given the findings of the Mueller report, whether or not Congress should begin impeachment proceedings against Donald Trump. By a 58% to 37% margin, Marylanders believe that Congress **should not** begin impeachment proceedings that could lead to Trump being removed from office. This contrasts pointedly with the 50% in our January poll who thought that Congress **should** begin the impeachment process against Trump.

Perhaps Marylanders agree with President Ford that our Constitution works.

Nonetheless, President Trump continues to struggle with Maryland voters. Statewide, 39% approve of the job Trump is doing as president, while 59% disapprove. Among Democrats (80% disapprove) and African-Americans (84% disapprove), Trump's numbers are in a wretched condition.

Perhaps Trump can request that his name be removed from the 2020 ballot in the Free State since he hasn't released his taxes.

Governor Larry Hogan comes out of the recently completed legislative session as popular as ever...or has Jerry Seinfeld might say, Hogan is Bizarro World's Donald Trump. Statewide, an imposing 76% approve of the job Hogan is doing, while 19% disapprove.

Hogan is that rare Republican who has broad acceptance among Democrats and independents. However, his expansive appeal does not seem to translate against Trump in a GOP presidential primary.

In a hypothetical 2020 primary matchup, Hogan currently trails in his home state by a daunting 24% to 68% margin. This result illuminates a salient point

in American electoral polity – campaigns are a two-step process, and general election attractiveness means nothing if one can not navigate step 1's primary.


Overall, Marylanders seem to be generally contented, as 60% say things in the state are moving in the right direction, compared to 24% who say things are on the wrong track.

Gonzales May 2019 Poll Results

Among Maryland voters, 39% approve of the job Donald Trump is doing as president (30% "strongly approve" and 9% "somewhat approve"), while 59% disapprove of the job President Trump is doing (51% "strongly disapprove" and 8% "somewhat disapprove"), with 2% offering no response.

President Trump Job Approval



Governor Larry Hogan


Very high job performance numbers for Governor Larry Hogan continue. Statewide, 76% approve of the job Larry Hogan is doing as governor (44% "strongly approve" and 32% "somewhat approve"), while 19% disapprove of the job Hogan is doing (10% "strongly disapprove" and 9% "somewhat disapprove"), with 5% giving no opinion.



Statewide, 60% of voters say that things in Maryland are moving in the right direction, while 24% say things are off on the wrong track, with 16% offering no response.





Special Counsel Russian Collusion Investigation

Among Maryland voters, 64% believe that Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation of possible collusion between Donald Trump's 2016 presidential campaign and Russia was fair and objective, while 22% feel that it was not fair and objective, and 14% offer no opinion.

President Trump Impeachment

We asked Maryland voters, "In light of the Mueller report findings, do you think Congress should, or should not, begin impeachment proceedings that could lead to Donald Trump being removed from office?"

Statewide, 37% think Congress **should** begin impeachment proceedings that could lead to Donald Trump being removed from office, while 58% believe Congress **should not** begin impeachment proceedings, with 5% giving no opinion.



Support for impeachment of Trump has dropped significantly since our January 2019 poll conducted at the beginning of that year.

In that survey, a full 50% of Maryland voters approved of Congress beginning the impeachment process against President Trump.

GOP Presidential Primary

Among 2020 GOP primary voters, their choice for president, at this point, is clear. As popular as Governor Hogan is in Maryland, he can only muster 24% in a hypothetical matchup with Donald Trump, who snares 68% for renomination, with 8% undecided.



Trump leads Hogan 62%-28% with women, and 74%-20% among men. Older Republican primary voters support Trump by a greater than 3-to-1 margin, 75%-21%.
